*Note: Program prerequisites are to be completed before beginning coursework for the MBA for those students who have not completed prerequisite (or an appropriate equivalent) within five years of entering the program and having earned a grade of B or better. If the appropriate prerequisite is completed more than five years prior to entering the program, the department will allow a waiver if the student demonstrates command of the content area by successfully completing a waiver examination. Prerequisite may not count as elective in the 36-credit-hour MBA.*

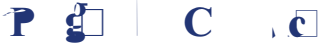
The Master of Arts in Business and Organizational Security Management degree requires satisfactory completion of 21 credit hours of the SECR curriculum and 15 credit hours of graduate electives for a total of 36 credit hours. Qualified CGSC graduates enrolled in the M.A. in Business and Organizational Security Management are awarded 15 semester hours transfer credit, which is applied as a 3 semester hour required core course and 12 semester hours of elective courses in the SECR program. ## M A J O R I N T L

The Master of Arts (M.A.) in International Relations enables CGSC students to add to their military studies in analyzing the complexities and processes involved in world politics and international affairs. Webster University coursework provides exposure to the key subfields of the international community and relevant issues such as globalization, human rights, humanitarian action, and economic development. This program is ideal for CGSC students continuing their military career at the joint operational and strategic levels of service, to include governmental agencies, intergovernmental organizations, nongovernmental organizations, or multinational corporations. This program is also recommended to students planning to pursue a Ph.D., or an academic career at other institutions.



The 36 credit hours required for the Master of Arts (M.A.) degree must include the following courses for a major in International Relations:

- INTL 5000 Introduction to International Relations (3 credit hours)
- INTL 5100 Research Methods and Perspectives (3 credit hours)
- Three courses from Comparative Politics Cluster (6 credit hours)
- Three courses from International Politics Cluster (12 credit hours)
- Three International Relations Elective Courses (9 credit hours)
- INTL 6000 International Relations: Theory and Practice (3 credit hours)

## A

Requirements for admission to the CGSC Cooperative Masters Degree Program are as follows:

- ◆ This agreement between the U. S. Army Command and General Staff College and Webster University will apply to all officers completing CGSC to include U.S. Marine Corps, U.S. Air & Army National Guard, U.S. Air & Army Reserve U.S. Air Force, U.S. Navy and International Officers. All participants in the program must submit an official transcript from CGSC that reflects CGSC course work required of each degree in this program. (see note below).
- ◆ Completion of a bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited college or university, and submission of an official transcript reflecting conferral of degree.
- ◆ Completion and submission of the Webster University graduate school application form with nonrefundable application fee.
- ◆ Participants in this program are not required to complete separate graduate entrance examinations such as Graduate Record Exam (GRE), Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT), or Miller's Analogy Test (MAT). Letters of recommendation will not be required.
